- STEP 3** **For your third year work, complete the plan, present it to your Court of Honour; once approved, submit the plan to the AC or the DAC Program or DAC Troop by the deadline.**
- STEP 4** Do the plan and journalize your third year work.
- STEP 5** Upon completion, fill in and submit the award application to the AC by the deadline.
